

# Coyote Classic at Avimor

**Quality:** \*\*\*\*

**Distance:** 23.75 miles (expert loop)

**Difficulty:** Advanced

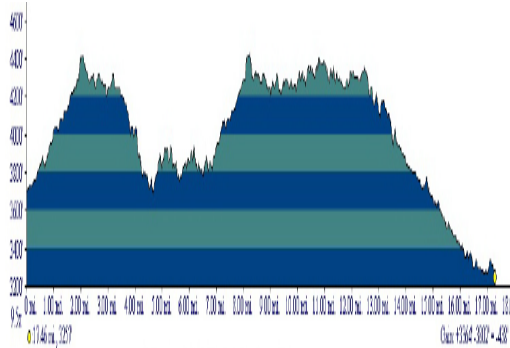
**Riding time:** 2+ hours

**Tread:** Two-track

**Vertical gain:** 3,365 feet

**Season:** Late April - October

**Watch out for:** Wildlife and other trail users



**Getting there:** From

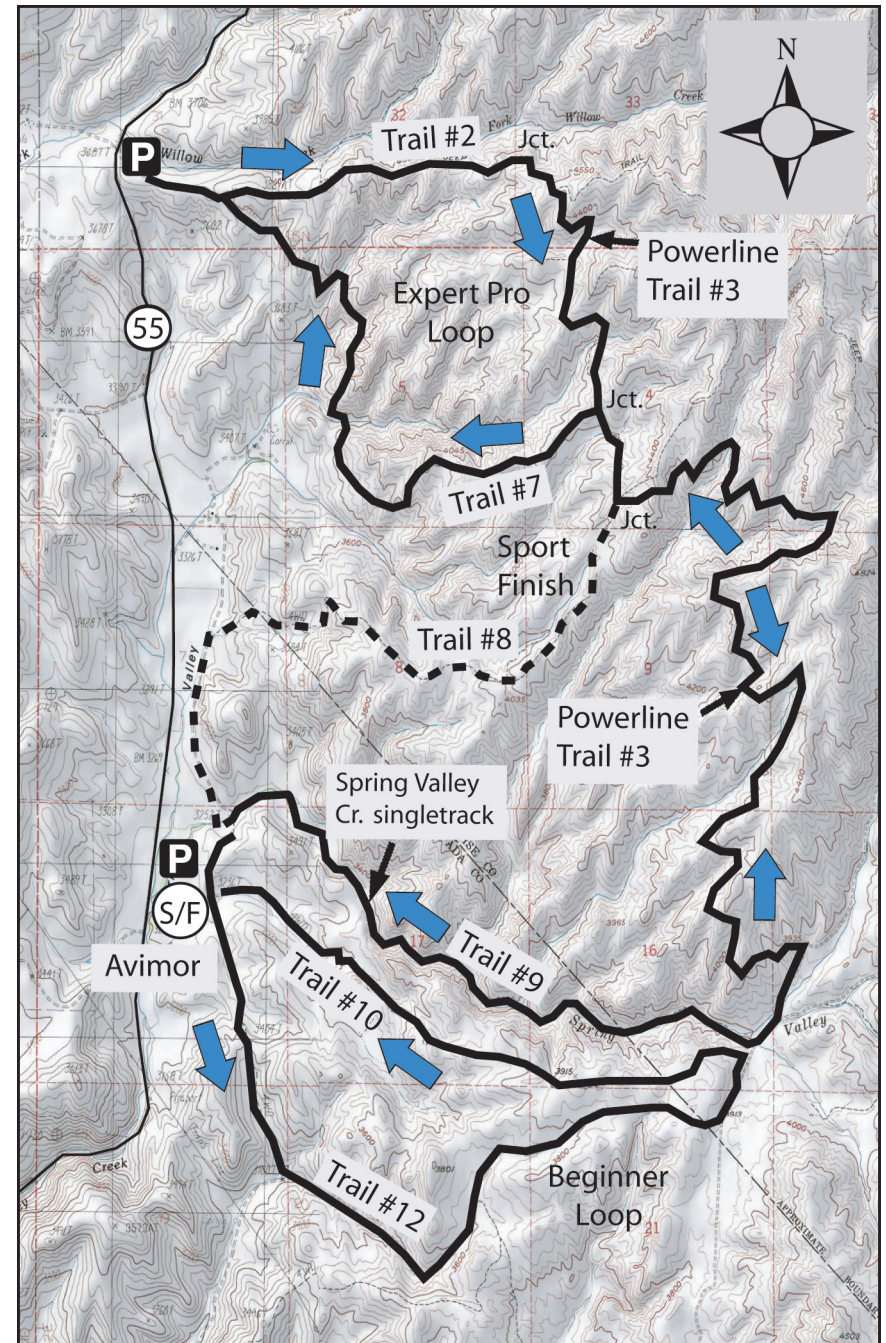
downtown Boise, take W.

State Street to Idaho 55. Go north on ID 55 to Avimor. Turn right into the main Avimor entrance. Go straight at the first junction and park at the trailhead. The ride starts here.

**The Ride:** Thanks to the Knobby Tire Race series for sharing the course layout and notes. Three different courses are shown on the map: the long Expert Pro loop (23.75 miles), Sport Loop (15.25 miles) and Beginner Loop (5 miles). Since this ride is listed in the advanced section of the book, I recommend that you ride the long loop.

**To begin,** head up Trail #12, a two-track that dissolves to singletrack and ride the beginner loop. At the creek junction, take a hard left to catch Trail #10 and ride back to the start. Go back on Trail #12 and go straight at the Spring Valley Creek junction. Watch for a left-hand turn on Trail #3 and climb the Powerline Trail, another jeep road, past the Trail #8 junction, and then go left on Trail #7 to do a loop with Trail #2 before descending the Powerline Trail to Trail #10, and finish on the Spring Valley Creek singletrack. Sport riders did one loop on the beginner trail, climbed the Powerline trail, and then dropped out on Trail #8 to finish.

Avimor has a trail map on its web site, [www.avimor.com](http://www.avimor.com). It's my understanding that Avimor plans to mark the trails on the ground to conform with the trail map. But this may take a while. So you may have to do some route finding on your own, using my map or their map for navigation.
